From the desk of Oak Hills Treasurer, Steve Bain

In November 2015, the County Auditor provided Property Valuations for collection year 2016.

Our valuations increased by 0.18% from the prior year. The County Auditor reappraises values every three years (and last year was a reappraisal year). The minimal increase in property valuations aligns with projections in the District's most recent five-year

financial forecast. While the increase in valuation is small, this is the first increase in property valuations since 2007!

Historical Trends (collection year):

2009 = -1.11% (reappraisal)

2010 = -0.11%

2011 = -0.15%

2012 = -9.74% (reappraisal)

2013 = -0.25%

2014 = -0.23%

2015 = -3.64% (reappraisal)

2016 = 0.18%

Ever wonder how much you pay in school taxes as compared to other districts in Hamilton County? Out of the 23 Hamilton County School Districts, Oak Hills residents pay the 5th lowest amount of school taxes. (See chart on right from the County Auditor.)
