His career path included developing newsroom technology for WCPO. Cincinnati Bell was next to benefit from Brian's talents. While there Brian developed an online database, The White Pages, putting an end to the aging, heavy and usually outdated phone books. And again it was these skills which led Brian and his wife Laura to solve a problem at their church. How to reach people who for various reasons could not come to church? The solution became "Streamspot". Streamspot now produces live streaming productions in 50 states and 11 countries reaching millions of viewers and has earned recognition in the Cincinnati Business

Hall of Honor Award



The Oak Hills Board of Education and it's selection committee for the Hall of Honor has selected Frank Shaut. Coach Shaut started with the Oak Hills family immediately following college. Football was his sport of choice and he attended the University of Cincinnati on a football scholarship. While in college, Coach Shaut helped UC start their wrestling program. As both teacher and coach, Shaut showed a passion for wrestling and teaching. For nine years (1965 to 1974) he coached wrestling at Oak Hills High School. He coached Oak Hills to 6 league championships, 4 district championships and 4 city championships. In 1974 Oak Hills placed 3rd in the state and had an individual champion. Coach Shaut is a member of the University of Cincinnati Athletic Hall of Fame.

Additionally, he is recognized in the Ohio and the Southwest district Wrestling Coaches Hall of Fame.

In 1974, Coach Shaut went to Delhi Junior High as the Assistant Principal and then on to Oak Hills High School as Class principal from 1980 -1993.

We have had the privilege of knowing Frank Shaut as a teacher, coach, and administrator. He will be receiving his award on October 7th, 2020 at the Annual Recognition Dinner at Western Hills Country Club.

OAK HILLS ALUMNI & EDUCATION FOUNDATION GRANTS

Shortly after the Oak Hills Educational Foundation was established, the Foundation felt one way to support the district was to fund grants for programs that could not be funded by tax dollars (due to lack of funds or the scope of those programs). So for the 2001-02 school year, the Foundation funded five such grants with the limited funds that it had. As the donor base increased in the last almost twenty years and as the Foundation has undertaken more fundraising activities, the number of grants increased to 51 for the 2019-20 school year totaling over \$28,000. In the last ten years, the Foundation has provided over \$160,000 for these educational grants.

Those of you who have had the advantage of receiving an OH education know that you were blessed with gifted, innovative, challenging and caring teachers who did an outstanding job with the resources the school district had. I am happy to report that the teaching staffs of today have carried on that tradition. They are also very gifted, innovative and caring teachers who go to any length to provide extra learning and enrichment opportunities for their students. The Foundation is privileged to be able to assist them through the grant program as they challenge their students and provide diverse opportunities for them. A BIG thank you to those who have donated to the Foundation and made these grants possible. Some of the programs funded are listed below, but the list is far from exhaustive. Thank you again for your support. We seek to help the district stay strong, innovative and a leader in the educational world.

Some of the grants funded for 2019-20: Student led tutoring programs, student led community service projects, teamwork projects for students with disabilities, musical instruments and props, musical concert experiences, musicals at all elementary and middle schools, resources for differentiated learning in math, student art projects to enhance their buildings, STEM projects at various levels, science fairs, programs to improve skills of at-risk students, after school reading clubs, team building activities for grade levels, career building experiences, production of products applying knowledge gained in class, programs to supplement everyday curriculum that help apply learned concepts, special needs class physical fitness programs, incentive programs for student attendance and achievement, activities that extend learning beyond the regular class day curriculum, enrichment programs beyond the regular curriculum, visual art project for BLINK representing OHHS. You can see that they have a wide range and reflect the work teachers are doing well beyond the regular school day and curriculum. I hope this has provided some insight as to how the OHAEF is supporting the district and how the teachers are providing varied opportunities for their students.

Great Things Happening in Virtual Learning

It goes without saying, but I'll say it anyway, the last 12 weeks of the 19-20 school year has come to an end in a way none of us could have ever imagined. The educational system was turned upside down to put it mildly, but Oak Hills staff throughout the district, not only rose to the occasion but in many cases surpassed the expectations put upon them.

At Springmyer Elementary, second grade teachers, Mrs. Walker, Mrs. Luebbe, and Mrs. Burtke each drove to their second graders' houses, delivering smiles and sidewalk chalk messages. "We let them know that we were coming so we were greeted with chalk messages and door signs, and little faces smiling through windows!" The teachers the set up penpals in their class and students keep in contact with each other while practicing their writing. The physical education teacher, Mrs. Elliott, included Springmyer in the National Field Day on May 8th. Teachers and staff recorded themselves completing the events and posted them on the Springmyer Fame Facebook to encourage students to participate. Kindergarten teachers Kristen Niehaus and Mrs. Casey really had a lot of fun learning and creating new things during this remote learning! They have utilized Google Classroom and created teaching videos, but their favorite has been using Google Meet to interact with their students. They always end their day with a Scavenger Hunt -where kids are given clues, and based on those clues, the students have to search their house for the item described. "We learn while having fun and of course we get to see those sweet faces!" said Mrs. Niehaus.

At Bridgetown Middle School, 6th grade Laserbeam team, Melissa Claus, Nichole Miller, Theresa Kroeger, Erin Eiser, and Eric Rothwell have gone to houses to continue to carry on their Leading Laserbeam award.

Another great thing happening is by first year Art teacher, Ms. Katie Jacob, at Oak Hills High School. She has formed a really good bond with her Tartan Time students and is having weekly virtual meetings with her students just to connect and build morale. She's done a fantastic job meeting the social emotional needs of her group. This is not a requirement of teachers but she is going above and beyond because she knows her students value their TT group. Thank you, Katie Jacobs!

Heather Packer and Jenni Budde from Oakdale Elementary have continued lessons and story time which is a big hit. Who doesn't love to be read to, even if it is done virtually!
